Trilobites of the Bull River Valley

The area surrounding Cranbrook has a surprising diversity of trilobite species. The Bull River Valley just to the east of the city is no exception. Dr. Chatterton's lecture will focus on the significance of these trilobites as well as other Canadian trilobite species.



Dr. Brian Chatterton is an expert on paleontology with numerous monographs and articles on the subject. Dr. Chatterton received his Ph.D. from Australian National University, going on to teach at the University of Alberta starting in 1970 where he is currently an emeritus professor. He is also the recipient of a number of medals and awards including the D.A. Brown Medal for services to geology from the Australian National University, and the Billings Medal from the Paleontology Division of the Geological Association of Canada.
